How to access electronic documentation?

1. Click & Read

- browser plugin,
- scans web pages looking for document identifiers,
- adds a button **C'R** if the document is accessible,
- simple to configure,
- several sources interrogated,
- one can choose the order of interrogation.

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2. BU Connect (Lyon 1)

- this is the proxy from Lyon 1 (accessible to all members of ICJ),
- is installed as a bookmark in your web browser,
- on the page of an article, just click on this bookmark and you are granted access (if Lyon 1 paid for it).

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. Sites 

- easy to use,
- fast,
- illegal.

Lyon 1 identifiers

All members of ICJ have a Lyon 1 electronic account.

- It is useful to access articles the university paid for.
- You need to activate it:

HAL

HAL is an multidisciplinary open archive developed by the CCSD (support and research unit of the CNRS, Inria, INRAE).

HAL enables the sharing of research results, whether published or unpublished, on an *open access basis*, and their *long-term archiving*.

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HAL plays a very important role in French Open Science policy.

The lists of scientific publications requested by HCERES are extracted from HAL (in other words, anything you do not submit to HAL will not appear in the laboratory evaluation report).

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- to submit all your scientific output to HAL,
- with the full text if applicable (it's better),
- for each submission, please include your team affiliation (AGL, CTN, EDPA, HM, MMCS, or PSPM) and the ICJ*.

Rk. You can also submit your work to [arXiv](#).

*This can be (almost) automatic if your HAL profile is correctly filled in!
